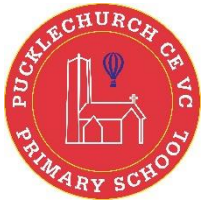


# Pupil Premium Provision Map 2023-24



## Inclusion Leader

20% of Inclusion Leader costs to oversee activities within school (Catch-Up programs) and to ensure that Pupil Premium provision is planned, actioned and assessed to maximise the impact of funding.

Cost: £6374

Outcome: Implementation of PP provision is in place

Overall impact of PP provision accurately assessed

The progress/attainment difference between PP pupils and their peers continues to diminish in some subjects.

The Pupil Premium is additional funding for schools to use to support pupils who are disadvantaged, assessed using Free School Meal entitlement information. Pucklechurch Primary School received £ 30,320, for this academic year.

## 1:1 & Small Group Catch-Up

Targeted interventions delivered by Class Teachers in 1:1 or group settings to support children with making progress in reading, writing and maths.

Cost: £5854

Outcome: The progress/attainment difference between PP pupils and their peers continues to diminish in some subjects..

## 1:1 & Small Group Catch-Ups

Targeted interventions delivered by Teaching/Reading Assistants in 1:1 or group settings to support children with making progress in reading, writing and maths, as well as with social, emotional and mental health.

Cost: 5888

Outcome: The progress/attainment difference between PP pupils and their peers continues to diminish in some subjects.

## Staff Development

Training to continually improve High Quality Teaching, including INSET training

Cost: £1,350

Outcome: Overall teaching rated good/outstanding  
The progress/attainment difference between PP pupils and their peers continues to diminish in some subjects..

## ECT/RQT Support

Focused support for newly qualified teachers to ensure that they develop the skills to teach effectively and plan successfully for vulnerable groups

Cost: £1713

Outcome: The progress/attainment difference between PP pupils and their peers continues to diminish. All ECTs complete their two induction years.

## Additional Outside Agency Support

Additional support from Inclusion Support Service. Speech and Language Therapy and Educational Psychology Service to support school in assessing and meeting needs of children

Cost: £2,400

Outcome: Good progress for PP children due to timely and effective professional advice, followed in school.

## Vulnerable Groups TA

Our VGTA works with families and children to provide pastoral care and support, signposting to relevant professionals and support links when necessary.  
Cost: £4217

Outcome: Attendance compared to previous year is improved for PP children; PP children demonstrate improvement in softer measures, e.g. resilience, independence, confidence  
PP children's engagement and sense of belonging in school is monitored and shows improvement  
Families are supported via targeted meetings, demonstrating purpose and impact

## Family Support

Assistance with school uniforms and associated resources, where need is greatest.  
Cost: £463

Outcome: Increased confidence and engagement in school.

## Breakfast/Afterschool Club

Free places for those in most need to ensure a positive start to the school day.  
Cost: £568

Outcome: Increased engagement and progress in learning.

## Subsidised Trips

School trips and residential funded to ensure access for all pupils.  
Cost: £725

Outcome: Most PP children attend school trips

## Resources

Ensuring that appropriate resources are provided to create in-school opportunities individually tailored to children, e.g. art therapy, enrichment activities  
Cost: £305

Outcome: Increased aspiration, motivation and engagement. Positive attitude towards school and learning.

## Crews

Ensuring that all PP children are able to belong to a school Crew, increasing engagement and building self-esteem  
Cost: £463

Outcome: Progress and attainment of PP children matches that of non-PP peers. Engagement and sense of belonging shows a demonstrable improvement.
