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# Assessment results

As you may be aware, each year in primary schools, children in years 1,4 and 6 take statory tests: year 1 are tested on their phonics understanding, year 4 undertake a multiplication timestables check and year 6 sit Standard Assessment Tests (SATs). We're also obliged to report our EYFS end of year data to the Local Authority. As always, we are so very proud of all of the children, their positive attitudes and the way they embodied our school vision of 'Aspire, Believe, Achieve'.

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# Do you quality for Free School Meals?





# Find out now if your family qualifies for <mark>free school meals.</mark>

# Your child may be able to get free school meals if you receive any of the following:

- Universal Credit (with income of less than £7,400)
- Child Tax credit (income of no more than £16,190)
- Income Support, Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or Incomerelated Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The 'guaranteed element' of Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit.
