Gympanzees

Gympanzees are a company based in Bristol who operate a lending library service for a range of specialist play and exercise equipment for chidlren



with special educational needs to use in their own homes - no diagnosis required. Items include weighted blankets, lightboxes, sensory boxes and a wide range of active and calming activities. Interfaith day

<u>Parking</u>

Please remember that the car park is for staff and those with permission from the school. To assist with this, those on our list will

be issued with a Pucklechurch permit – these will come out before the end of term and should be on your dashboard when you park in the carpark so that it is clear. Please do not park in our school car park without this.

Anti-Bullying Week

This week is national Anti-Bullying week. The theme was 'Make A Noise About Bullying'. At school, the children wore odd



socks on Monday and participated in assemblies where we talked about what it means to be truly anti-bullying. We talked about how it goes beyond simply not being a bully and includes speaking out or 'Making a Noise' if you hear or see anyone being bullied by others.

The children also joined in activities in class including creating a scale of bullying linked to the '5 point scale' that we use in school to support the children with regulating their emotions.



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Behaviour

We want our children to feel safe, happy and able to learn within a Positive Learning Culture. We encourage them to develop self-discipline, a respect for themselves, for others and for the environment. We value all God's children and celebrate and respect their differences. We follow our Christian Values, most notably in this context the value of Forgiveness, when resolving differences or supporting children to make positive choices.



The Pucklechurch Way:

Our philosophy can be summed up very simply: we expect our children to be safe, respectful and ready to learn. The meaning of these key aspects will be discussed regularly with children in class and in collective worship assemblies. To support them to demonstrate these aspects, all children belong to our Positive Learning Culture.

How we create a Positive Learning Culture

- o We are all responsible for creating a positive culture with clear expectations for how we behave how staff behave provides a model to children, including engaging with children around the school environment (saying hello in the corridor, holding the door open, etc.);
- o The school values support our Positive Learning Culture;
- o Children are welcomed into the classroom each morning by an adult;
- o The school takes a growth mindset approach to learning and celebrates effort and progress, rather than just pure attainment;
- o We positively reinforce good behaviour with praise and rewards. Sometimes, children might also share their achievements with other members of staff and be rewarded with a sticker;
- o Each class agrees a 'class contract', which is displayed clearly in the classroom;
- o In class, names are displayed to celebrate behaviour that is 'above and beyond' and children are rewarded with house points;
- o House points are awarded in lessons, along with the nomination and recognition of the 'Top Learner' of the day and week. Each class teacher also awards certificates to children each week for demonstrating the school values. These are given out in Celebration Assembly on a Friday;
- o Children who have consistently demonstrated the value of the term (one per class) are awarded with an afternoon tea with the head teacher at the end of term in recognition;
- o Staff regularly share children's successes with parents in a variety of ways, including face-to-face meetings, posts on social media, emails etc.
- o Attitudes to Learning and Social & Emotional skills are discussed with parents and children at the Autumn, Spring and Summer Learning Meetings;
- o Children are given jobs around the classroom and school to promote responsibility and self-esteem;
- o Upper Key Stage 2 children work with Reception children to model positive behaviour;
- o Children are awarded additional responsibilities around school, such as membership in a 'crew', because of their good attitude and behaviour. They are then expected to model this behaviour to the rest of the school;
- o We celebrate children's successes within our achievement assembly each week (these can be out of school too).



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Pupil Absence

If you have a planned absence for your child eg. Medical/dental appointment, Music exam or holiday; a Leave of Absence Form MUST be completed. These are available on the website or a paper copy from the office.

A reminder that medical appointments should be arranged outside of school hours and/or term time where possible, and evidence of the appointment needs to be provided if this is not possible. This will be marked as unauthorised absence without this proof.

Holidays should not be arranged during term time. In line with our school policy and guidance, we are submitting fixed penalty forms to the local authority where term time holiday is taken. We recognise that some pupils may find it harder to attend school than others, if your child is experiencing difficulties please speak to their class teacher in the first instance or ask to speak to Mrs Jones, our SENCO, so we can all work together to build trusting relationships and ensure support is in place. Due to the importance of good attendance, we will be monitoring it closely across the year, as part of this we may be in touch to discuss any issues or patterns in absence we notice.

Pupil Premium

The Pupil Premium is allocated to children from low-income families who are currently known to be eligible for free school meals and children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months. The Government extended eligibility for the Pupil Premium to pupils who have been eligible for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years.

Are you able to apply for free school meals?

If your child is eligible for free school meals, it is worth registering them even if they're not going to have the school lunch as it will have a direct impact on the funding we receive and the support we can provide.



Your child may be entitled to free school meals, if you are entitled to receive any of the following:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods, and your monthly average income over three assessment periods should be no more than £616.67)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

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English at Pucklechurch

At Pucklechurch, we expect all children to read five times a week, regular reading is the key to expanding vocabulary and linking knowledge to develop connections, improved word recognition, builds fluency and secure understanding.

Reading should be logged in children's reading records or on the recording sheet, our target is 90% of all classes reading 5 times per week.

Each week children should be bringing home a 'Big Cat' book which matches their reading level and a 'Reading for Pleasure' book which the children can choose based on their interests. Children then have opportunities to change these books throughout the week, when they have practised reading them and built up their fluency.

During the week there are many opportunities to read, including Whole Class reading lessons where we focus on a specific reading skill such as: retrieval, inference, vocabulary and summarising. In our Guided reading sessions children read in small groups with an adult and answer specific questions about the text they have read. They will also apply a range of their reading skills to work independently on either a seen or unseen text. In smaller groups some children will also be having phonics sessions 5 times a week, 2 phonics and 3 reading sessions to help with recall and fluency. Little Wandle is our phonics scheme which promotes the learning of sounds, early reading skills and promotes a love of reading. It is important that children are regularly practising their sounds at home and these are being referred to when reading their 'Big Cat' books. At the front of these books it has the sounds which will be covered, along with tricky words the children may encounter when reading. For our spelling scheme we use Essential Spellings, this focuses more on the teaching of spelling so that children understand how to apply patterns, strategies

and knowledge to all words. It also provides links to prior knowledge and tracks back. It promotes spellers for life, rather than just learning spelling for a week. We have spelling lessons each day and a spelling test

once a week.

Maths at Pucklechurch

At Pucklechurch, we follow White Rose. Learning is broken down into small steps to embed knowledge through activities focussed on varied fluency, reasoning and problem solving.

A CPA approach where we use concrete resources such as counters and cubes before using pictorial representations followed by an abstract approach where children can apply what they know is used. In every Maths lesson, we use a See, Share, Do approach where the adults model the concept being taught before working through a question as a class. After this, the children will complete a question on their own. They might either continue to work independently or may be supported in a guided group.

We also have regular arithmetic and times table sessions where we focus on key number facts and calculation strategies. In our arithmetic sessions, the week's questions follow the same structure so that children know previously difficult questions will appear in the same position throughout the week.

For homework, children will receive questions based upon what they have been learning in class. KS1 are also expected to access Numbots and KS2 are expected to access TT Rockstars as part of their weekly homework. We award certificates in our achievement assembly on a Friday to celebrate successes using these programs.



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Reverse Advent Calendar

Our value for Term 2 is 'Generosity'. We're sure you will agree that one of the best ways to show the value of generosity is by donating to people who are less fortunate than ourselves which is why, this year, we will be taking part in the North Bristol Foodbank's Reverse Advent Calendar so that everyone can spread a little Christmas joy and help people to have the Christmas celebrations with their families that they deserve.

How does it work?

The reverse advent calendar operates a month early so that the foodbank can distribute these items to families throughout December so for each day of November, the Advent Calendar below has a different item of food which we would like you to bring to school.

What shall I bring in?



Remember that everything should be ambient (not fresh fruit or vergetables and not kept in a fridge or freezer).

When shall I bring in the items?

So that you aren't having to remember to bring different items on different days, you can collect any items for each week of the reverse advent calendar and bring them to school on a Friday.

Where shall I bring them?

You can give them to your child to give to their class teacher or we will have a donations box in the office area to drop them into.

How can I help further?

If you can spare Bags for Life or Christmas gift bags to transport the items to the Food Bank and for the Food Bank to distribute the items, please give these to your child's teacher or drop off at the office with your donations.
