Communication at Pucklechurch

As a school we place great importance on having open and honest communication with all of our families and we believe this is essential for our school to be the best it can be. Learning meetings

All families will be offered face to face meetings with your child's class teacher. These will be in term 2, 4 and 6.

Reports

Rather than sharing just one long report at the end of the year, we choose to write 3 one-page reports for you when you attend learning meetings so that you know how your child is getting along at school.

Emails to parents

You can email your child's class teacher about anything to do with your child 's academic progress or anything else that you are worried about or think they need to know. Anything that is more to do with lost belongings, details about pick-ups, time off and lunches etc can be emailed to the office team instead. Wellbeing

Each week, one of our Collective Worships is centred around 'Awe and Wonder'. During this assembly, we share an image and consider what it means to us and what it makes us think about. The children pose big questions and it's wonderful to see the many directions that one simple image can take them.



This week, the image was the sunset or sunrise below. We talked about how the amount of daylight each day is decreasing as we get towards winter; we shared experiences of how

sometimes, often on holiday, we enjoy a sunset on a beach with other holiday makers and, when the sun finally disappears seemingly behind the sea, people on the beach clap and cheer.



We talked about why people might clap after something that occurs every single day and the children suggested that it might be a way of showing appreciation for a number of things: the beautiful sunset or on a personal level, 'another good day'. Some children felt that it might be a way of thanking God for the sunset and the world around them.

One child remarked that whenever they look at the sunrise or sunset, they liked the fact that other people could see the same thing and it made them feel connected to friends and family and sometimes complete strangers and it made them happy. Others agreed that connecting with others is an important way to feel good and one which certainly helps our well-being.



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
