

Safeguarding

If you have any concerns about safeguarding, please do speak to one of them. At times, you may wish to report something that you are aware of happening outside of school. You can report anonymously to the Access and Response team if you have concerns about a child or, if you have concerns about your own personal circumstances, you can self-refer.
