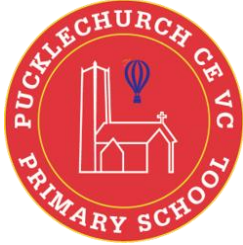
Smartphone Free Community

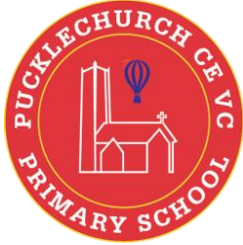

Reading at Pucklechurch

Part of our commitment to the education of the children is ensuring that we move with new legislation, research and guidance in order to ensure that the children’s lessons align to statutory instruction and that teaching remains up-to-date using evidence based strategies.

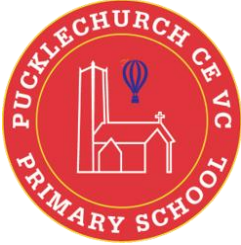
With this in mind, the Pucklechurch team spent part of the INSET day at the start of this term reviewing our approach to teaching reading.

All of our children’s reading journey begins with phonics which is the way we teach children how to decode and make meaning of written language. Over the last few years, we have developed our phonics offer and continue to monitor its implementation.

Our focus at this term’s INSET was based around developing reading fluency and we continued to use the Department for Education (DfE) document: [The reading framework](#) as well as evidence based research conducted by the [Education Endowment Foundation | EEF](#) to enhance how we teach reading beyond initial decoding.

The children will therefore notice a couple of changes to their reading lessons in years 2 upwards which we hope will support the development of children’s fluency. We wanted to share these changes with parents too:

Current Practice	The change that will be made this term
Children are introduced to a new text at the start of each week and had the opportunity to read through it at the start of each lesson	<p>Children will still be introduced to a new text at the start of each week. However, instead of reading the text through at the start of each lesson, there will now be a specific reading lesson at the start of the week focussed solely on developing the fluency of reading the text.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The teacher will introduce the text in context and pre-teach some key vocabulary to aid understanding • The children will hear a model of how the text should sound from the teacher leading the session who will point out which words to emphasise, how to respond to the punctuation and share the appropriate speed to read • The children will work in pairs to practise reading the text to build fluency and practise reading aloud. During this time, the teacher will either work with a specific group of children or ‘drop in’ to each pair to hear how they are doing • The session will end with a brief discussion about the text to begin the ‘book talk’ that will follow in the week to explore deeper understanding of the text.
<p>Children whose word decoding is behind that of their peers have a daily small group reading intervention session focussed on improving phonics</p> <p>Each week, all children have a small-group reading session. The teacher hears</p>	<p>Small group reading will only take place for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • children whose phonics knowledge is behind that of their peers (they will continue to have a daily phonics small-group intervention). • children who have acquired the phonics skills they need but require lots of opportunities to develop their reading automaticity (ability to read most words ‘at a glance’) <p>Children whose reading fluency is already at the level where their decoding is so automatic that they are able to read with expression, tone and pace will no longer have small-group fluency sessions and will use this lesson for deeper reading comprehension based activities. This means that children whose reading aloud is considered fluent will read aloud to adults less frequently. They will still practise this skill and their teacher will still hear them read within whole class reading fluency lessons but the focus for them will be on making meaning from the text with comprehension activities to deepen understanding.</p>

If you are able to donate 'Bags for Life' to help with the collection and distribution on the items, we would be grateful.

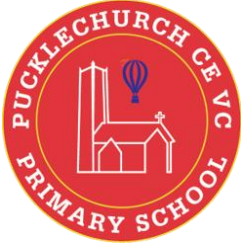
